4	<i>Designed by John Nash and named after George IV before he was King.</i>		
5	<i>Was home to British banking, named after an Italian region.</i>		
6	<i>The cheapest place in London (according to Monopoly).</i>		
7	<i>Where the Great Fire of London was said to have started.</i>		
8	<i>Known as Britain’s “Tin Pan Alley”.</i>		
9	<i>The street patrolled by Larry the Cat.</i>		
10	<i>Featured on the cover of a 1969 album by The Beatles.</i>		
11	<i>A statue of Beau Brummell stands in this street in St James’s.</i>		
12	<i>Home to the Lyric, Apollo and Sondheim theatres.</i>		
13	<i>More than 3000 people are employed in the medical field on this street.</i>		
14	<i>Title of novel by Monica Ali shortlisted for the Booker Prize.</i>		
15	<i>Joins Marble Arch to Tottenham Court Road.</i>		
16	<i>Home to the legendary Marquee Club.</i>		
17	<i>Joins with Fleet Street and Trafalgar Square on the Monopoly board.</i>		
18	<i>Where the “Old Lady” looks after our money.</i>		
19	<i>Where the London Marathon finishes.</i>		
20	<i>Title of a 1983 UK no.3 by Gerry Rafferty.</i>		
21	<i>Perhaps rabbits live in this thoroughfare.</i>		
22	<i>Scene of a 1936 “Battle” against Moseley’s fascists.</i>		
23	<i>Home to a flower market every Sunday.</i>		
24	<i>Known for bespoke tailoring and the home of the Royal Geographical Society.</i>		
25	<i>London’s first police ran on this street.</i>
